During that time, he enjoyed playing slow pitch and participating in the pool league for The Hitching Post Tavern.

After his schooling, Dennis returned to Leavenworth and began logging. Due to his love for the outdoors, he was given the nickname, "Pine Tree". Dennis truly had a servant's heart and knew he wanted to make a difference in others' lives, which lead Dennis to began his career at Chelan County PUD in 1976. Hired on as a Meter Reader, Dennis was employed there for 37 years and retired as a Serviceman.
