Alice Elaine Murr was born to William and Clara Montpetit, in Beaulieu, North Dakota on September 22, 1923. She passed away in Wenatchee, Washington on December 23, 2014.

Alice was preceded in death by her parents, William and Clara Montpetit; sisters, Bernice Taylor, Ethel Magnus, Beatrice Linders, Lillian Hatch and Hazel Vardaro and her own daughter, Pamela Seltenreich. She is survived by her brother, William (Bill) Montpetit of Wenatchee, WA; sister, Myrtle Gislason of Wasilla, Alaska; grandson, Jimmy Seltenreich of Lake Havasu, Arizona; many nieces and nephews, great nieces and nephews and a host of friends.

In 1936, Alice and her parents moved from North Dakota to Washington State. They initially settled at the Sunset Lodge on Snoqualmie Pass and Alice attended Easton High School. After graduating in 1940, she landed her first job as a clerk with the Milwaukee Railroad.

Alice left this position and moved to Seattle where she met and married Harold Frayer in 1944. They had one daughter named Pamela.

For several years following Pamela's birth, Alice worked for the Boeing Company where she was employed as a supervisor in record keeping.

In 1960, she made a trip to Alaska to visit family. During this trip, Alice decided to stay. She quickly found employment with the U.S. Public Health Department. In this job, Alice helped in the transport of Native children and others as they traveled by plane from Bush country into the city for medical treatment.

In 1964, Alice went to work for her brother Bill at Sig Wold Transfer and Storage. For many years, she worked as a household clerk in charge of typing up invoices, creating bills of lading and managing the billing.

She married Darrell Murr in 1966.

In 1976, she moved to Anchorage for the company. At that time, she became Office Manager for the Anchorage branch of Sig Wold Transfer and Storage. Alice retired in 1986.

That same year, she moved to Lake Havasu, Arizona and lived with her daughter Pamela until she found a place of her own. Alice stayed in Lake Havasu until 2009 when she moved to Wenatchee, WA to live with her brother, Bill and sister, Ethel.

Alice was full of life. She was a responsible employee and a loyal friend. She had a tremendous sense of humor, was a fantastic cook and was known by family to be a Formula One scooter driver

In later life, Alice made her choice to serve the Lord. She never looked back and enjoyed sweet fellowship with others that she cherished until her death.
