Angela A. Aumell, a 74-year Wenatchee resident, passed away at home on December 22, 2011, at the age of 96. She was born in Missoula, MT, on July 13, 1915, to Harry and Anne Derosier Holden. She lived in Thermopolis, Riverton, and Lander, WY. In 1933, she graduated from Gallatin County High School in Bozeman, MT. She attended Sacred Heart School of Nursing from 1935 to 1937 in Spokane, WA. On December 29, 1937, Angie married Stanley C.

(Mike) Aumell in Bozeman and moved to Great Falls. In February 1938, they moved to Wenatchee, where Angie became a member of St. Joseph Parish. She

was active in the St. Eugene, St. Anne, and St. Veronica's guilds. In 1963, she became a Licensed Practical Nurse at WVC., She worked at Deaconess on

the surgical floor and emergency room and later at Central Washington Hospital in the ER. She belonged to the Washington Critical Care Nurses Association and the District of Washington State LPN Association. Angie was honored as Nurse of the Year in 1982. She volunteered for the American Cancer Society, I Can Cope program, and Respite Care.
