Barbara R. Marotta, 81, passed away on Thursday, October 2, 2014 at Columbia Heights Retirement in Wenatchee, with her daughter by her side. She was born on January 2, 1933 in Wenatchee to Maurice and Hazel Gwinn. She attended Wenatchee Schools and graduated from Wenatchee High School in 1951. Barbara attended Washington State University in Pullman, where she sang in the choir and became an accomplished opera singer.

She was a secretary for Washington State Department of Transportation and in 1976 she went to work for Central Washington Hospital as a Supervisor of Housekeeping, retiring in 1996.
