Brian Manhart Died Sunday, June 21, 2015, after a short illness in a hospital in Burien, WA. He was born in San Diego, CA on April 25, 1957, to Dr. John and Dolores Manhart and lived on the Island of Saipan from 1962 to 1964, while Dr. John was stationed there with the U.S Navy. He had great memories of that time in his life.

Briefly back to San Diego, they moved to Wenatchee, WA in 1964. Shortly after moving here, he learned to ski, which led to a lifetime love of the activity and to many special friendships. Brian attended Whitman Elementary, Orchard Jr High, and graduated from Wenatchee High School in 1975. He then attended Washington State University, where he became a lifelong Cougar.

Beginning in the summers while at WSU, he worked at Hanna Mining, which later became American Silicon Technologies, working there until the mid 1990's. From there, he went to Stemilt Growers, running the entire shipping department out of the Olds Station facility. He spend a brief time at The Wenatchee World, but the best job ever was being on the Mission Ridge Professional Ski Patrol - he hot paid to ski!

He married Wendy Woods in 1980, and son, Kellen was born in 1986. He was a member of the Mission Ridge Volunteer Ski Patrol, a Wenatchee Applearian in the 80's Chevy Camaro, gifted to him by the original owner, his mom. He would occasionally enter it in local car shows when Kellen was showing his car.

He was preceded in death by brother, John A Manhart; mom, Dolores; and just last week ,his father , Dr. John Manhart. He is survived by son, Kellen; wife, Wendy; and brother, Fred Manhart.

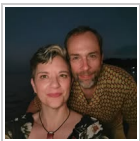
