Elaine retired from Peoples Department store in 1982 after 14 years where she eventually ran the Housewares Department. Elaine loved to host social get together's especially during the Christmas season, her favorite time of the year. She loved to give and give of herself, and will be deeply missed on these special occasions.

Elaine is survived by her husband of 56 years, Joseph Seabeck of East Wenatchee, her brother Gary Stewart of Bermuda Dunes, CA, son John Seabeck and wife Susan, daughter Diane Parker and husband Andy, son Robert Seabeck and wife Vickie, all of Wenatchee, daughter Carol Addington and husband Tim, of Orange Beach, AL, nine grandchildren and one great granddaughter.
