



Frances L. Davis

September 11, 1931 - July 2, 2015

Frances Louella (Weaver) Davis, 83, passed away peacefully in her home with her family and friends at her side on July 2, 2015 in Wenatchee, WA. She was born on September 11, 1931 in Peoria, Illinois to William B. Weaver and Frances Morris Weaver.

She is survived by her loving husband of 66 years, Lowell D. Davis of Wenatchee, her sons; James Davis, Steven Davis and daughter-in-law Angie Juchmes of Wenatchee, daughter, Shirley Davis and son-in-law, Michael Sofie of Seattle, WA, four grandchildren, sister; Nancy Mustard, brother-in-law Jim Mustard of Pekin, Illinois, brother-in-law, Robert Murray of Vacaville, CA and several cousins, nieces and nephews.

Frances moved with her parents, 4 sisters and 2 brothers from Peoria, Illinois to their farm in Arkansas in 1947. Frances always said she took one look at Lowell and said "she was going to date that boy and she might even marry him." They were married by Lowell's uncle Charles Davis in 1949 in Viola, Arkansas.

They moved to Peoria, Illinois but after the birth of James, moved to Cashmere, WA in 1952. Frances worked packing apples and taking care of her growing family. They were members of the Free Will Baptist Church in East Wenatchee.

In 1966 they purchased an apple orchard in Manson, WA. As the children grew up Frances began working for Highland House Convalescent Center in Chelan, WA. She was an active member of the First Baptist Church in Chelan.

Frances and Lowell invited friends, ministers and missionaries into their home to share their warmth roof and fabulous meals. Ask anyone who sat at their table, who made the best fried-chicken.

In 1973 they moved to Lake Stevens, WA, but missed Eastern Washington so much they returned, eventually settling in Wenatchee in 1974. Frances worked for Wenatchee Valley Hospital until her retirement.

Frances belonged to Calvary Crossroads Baptist Church and most recently Bethel Baptist Church in East Wenatchee. Although her health did not allow her to attend Church services these last few years, her bible was always open and her prayer list was the focus of her day.

A Graveside Service will be held Thursday morning , July 9, 2015 at 10:00 A.M at Evergreen Memorial Park, East Wenatchee, followed by a Memorial Service at 11:00 A.M. at Bethel Baptist Church, East Wenatchee, with Pastor John Sterk officiating.
