



Frederick "Fred" Streib

November 24, 1918 - September 13, 2010

Fred passed away peacefully on Monday, September 13, 2010 at the age of 91.

He was born November 24, 1918 in Cedar Mill, Oregon to Phillip Jr and Helen Wismer Streib and was raised in nearby Milwaukie, Oregon. He worked for many Northwest Companies as an accountant and also spent several years in the real estate business in St Louis, Missouri. In 1954, Fred was appointed as a member of the National Board of Field Advisors for Small Business Administration . For the past 34 years, Fred was the proprietor of Lake Wenatchee Village.

Fred was a musician and played the saxophone for church and school groups as well as a dance orchestra. An avid bowler, he won a gold medal in the Washington State Centennial Winter games (1989) as a senior. He also enjoyed playing cards and travelling to Reno, Las Vegas, and Hawaii.

He was preceded in death by daughters Cindy, and Tracy; sisters Evelyn, Hazel, and Betty.

He is survived by his devoted wife of 47 years Ferol, son's Doug Streib (Cheryl) of Tacoma, Greg Streib (Anne) of Seattle, four grandchildren,

five great grandchildren, step brother Wayne Marshal , numerous nieces and nephews , and business partner's and close friend's John and Jill Walker.
