James Daniel "Jim" Rogers, 62, of Shoreline, Washington died Tuesday, May 8, 2018 at Central Washington Hospital.

He was born July 10, 1955 to Dorothy and Maury Rogers of Cashmere. A twelve year student of the Cashmere School District, Jim graduated as Valedictorian of the Cashmere High School Class of 1973. While in high school, he was a member of the Bulldog basketball and tennis teams. Jim received an Accounting Degree from Washington State University in 1978 and soon after received his CPA license, leading to a career as a CPA and Financial Controller in the greater Seattle area. This profession enabled him an early retirement in which he enjoyed Seattle Mariner baseball, navigating the stock market, the strategy of a good poker game, and "hitting the road" in his beloved Mazda sports car.

Survivors include his mother, Dorothy Rogers of Cashmere; a brother Tom Rogers and wife Kate of Cashmere; a sister Janis Drescher and husband Brett of Orondo; and nephew and nieces Aaron Rogers and wife Laura of East Wenatchee; Jessica Griffin and husband Nathaniel of Lakebay, WA; Kacey Roberts and husband Zach of Lompoc, CA; and Allison of Spokane. He was preceded in death by his father.

A memorial service celebrating the life of Jim Rogers will be held Monday, May 14 at noon at Cashmere United Methodist Church, 213 S Division Street. Family and close friends will gather at Peshastin Cemetery Monday, May 14 at 10:30 for a committal service.
