



James "Ted" Taylor

January 5, 1953 - May 20, 2015

James Theodore "Ted" Taylor of Wenatchee, Washington, beloved teacher and coach, died at Harborview Medical Center in Seattle on May 20, 2015. He died from injuries sustained while trying to push his own disabled pick-up truck near CleElum, Washington. Ted was born in 1953 in Wenatchee, WA. To Jim and Estel Taylor. He attended Lewis and Clark Elementary, Orchard Jr. High and Wenatchee High School graduating in 1971. Ted coached football at WHS and Girls softball for 17 years. In 1992 he was WHS Teacher of the year and in 1993 voted Alumni of the Year. He retired in 2005 after 30 years of teaching. Ted was preceded in death by his mother Estel Taylor in 2009. He is survived by his father, Jim Taylor of Wenatchee, sister Camille (Chuck) Leidigh of Yaak, Montana, five nieces and nephews, and great nieces and nephews. Ted was buried at the family plot in the Wenatchee City Cemetery. There will be a memorial service on June 20th, 2015, at 10:30AM at the Wenatchee Brethren Baptist Church on Okanogan and Peachy Streets.
