In loving memory of Jim Jack, a man who loved his life, lived his dream and never met a stranger. Jim was born on October 20, 1965, in Bellevue, WA. He attended school in Redmond and Tacoma, where he graduated from Lakes High School in 1984. He then went on to graduate from CWU and also received an Associates degree in Ski Resort Management at WVC and was honored as Outstanding Graduate in the program.

He is survived by his life partner, Tiffany Ruthe Abraham of Leavenworth; parents, Barbara and Norman Jack of Lake Wenatchee; brother, Jay Jack (Nan) of Seattle; sister, Jodi Simmons (Chris) of Port Angeles; niece, Cierra Jack; and nephews, Sean and Travis Simmons.

From an early age, Jim knew his life was committed to freeskiing and promoting it worldwide. As past President of the IFSA, he accomplished this dream. For the past ten years, he had been judging internationally, head judge for the last six. Everyone Jim met, he cared about, and all who met him loved him. On February

19, 2012, our beloved Jim was killed in a tragic avalanche at Stevens Pass. Jim and two of his great friends, Johnny Brenan and Chris Rudolph, were enjoying a magical day of skiing together. The avalanche claimed their physical bodies and left their souls to soar.

There will be a public Viewing on Saturday, February 25, 2012, from 1:00 to 7:00 p.m. at Jones & Jones~Betts Funeral Home in Wenatchee.
