Kenneth Loren Pulse passed away December 29th 2021 in his home with his family by his side.

Kenny is survived by his wife of almost 60 years, Gracie Pulse, his brother Bill Pulse, son Mark Pulse and his wife Fonda, daughter Wendi Seabrook and her husband John.
