“ Ken Spurgeon and Randy Bartlett met at the Lincolnshire Country Club in south suburban Chicago in the mid-1950s and became golfing buddies for life. Over time they became lifelong friends and had more fun than any two guys had a right to have.

They were good golfers, not great ones, but were very competitive when it came to a two dollar nassau. They could often be found in the 19th hole celebrating a \$2 or \$4 victory and picking up the tab for drinks after the round.

Commencing around 1960, with golfing partners H. "TV" Johnson and Ed McNabney, Ken and Randy made something like 25 or 26 consecutive golf trips to Door County, Wisconsin over Memorial Day weekend. A typical four day weekend, often in marginal spring weather, involved hundreds of miles of driving, six rounds of golf, plenty of "beanbag", and several hours of detailed scoring, figuring out the wins and losses.

Ken fancied himself a great putter and few were better. He was, indeed, something of a raconteur. He was well-read, an excellent story teller, and possessed a great sense of humor. And...always a twinkle in his eye!

Sadly, Randy Bartlett passed away all too early at age 68 in 1989. Now Ken has passed. It is easy to imagine them, now reunited, again lining matches for the ages.

The Bartlett family remembers Ken fondly and passes on its deepest condolences to Betty Lou and the Spurgeon family.
