



## Loretta Lord

May 14, 1922 - August 17, 2017

Loretta Lord, 95, a resident of Wenatchee passed away, Thursday, August 17, 2017. Loretta was born in Williston, North Dakota on May 14, 1922 to Pearl and Oscar Lang. She spent her childhood there and on completion of high school she lived in Los Angeles going to business school. Later, while visiting in Everett, WA she met and soon married Stanley Lord of Snohomish, son of Floyd and Mayme Lord of Snohomish.

They were married January 1, 1942, three weeks after Pearl Harbor. Mr. Lord enlisted in the US Navy and served for 3 ½ years in the Pacific Theatre as a Signalman and Telegrapher. Later he completed his college years at Whitman College in Walla Walla, WA and they moved to Twisp, WA in 1952 where he taught school for 23 years.

Mrs. Lord had been a Twisp bookkeeper for 28 years and in later years became an apple sorter in a Pateros packing shed. Loretta had been a ceramist and later an oil painter. She and her husband had been active in the Twisp Methodist Church all their 43 years in the Methow Valley.

She was preceded in death by her husband in June of 1989. She is survived by two daughters; Diane Lord of Santa Monica, CA and Deborah Lord of Okanogan, WA. She has three grandchildren; Andy Hamm, Cody Lord and Brandy Rojas, and three great-grandchildren; Tyler Lord, Sadie Rojas, and Monty Rojas.

Loretta loved to travel and had many exciting trips to Europe, Australia, New Zealand, Scotland, Ireland, England, Mexico, Panama Canal (Three times!),

and Alaska. Her B-29 stowaway flight was a highlight of her younger years and the story was shown seven times or more on Seattle's TV "Evening Magazine" in 1998-2006

In the fall of 2004 and for her remaining years Don Marsh of Methow was her companion and travel partner, enjoying Hawaii, an Ocean Holland America cruise to Mexico, fishing, R.V.ing with friends, and hitching rides with Harleigh (Don's son-in-law.)

At her request, there will be no service. Cremation will take place and she will be buried beside her husband at the Grand Army of the Republic Cemetery in Snohomish.
