Lowell Dean Warner, 89, a resident of Orondo for 52 years, passed away on Wednesday, February 15, 2017.

He is survived by his wife of 66 years, Shan Warner; daughters, Luanna Laci of Spokane and Lee A. Hanson and her husband, Chris, of Orondo; four grandsons, Ian Campbell of Wrangell, AK, Brynn Lawless of East Wenatchee, Colt Lawless of Spokane, and Kai Lawless of East Wenatchee; five great-grandsons, Devlyn, Jaxon, Jett, Kydd, and Nico; and his sister-in-law, Rose Marie Hannahs along with many nieces and nephews.
