Lucille Smith passed away on Friday, April 26, 2013 in Wenatchee, WA after a brief illness. Lucille was 85 years young. Lucille had resided in Wenatchee until her three children were grown, and then went to live in Independence, MO with her husband, Marion D. Smith, to be with his family.

Lucille attended Waterville High School and in 1945 went on to Washington State University on a music scholarship. While attending WSU, she was featured on "Keynotes", a radio music program where Lucille played the piano. She became quite an accomplished pianist.

She was active in her Christian faith, her political organization, the East Wenatchee Garden Club, and with the local arts community. She helped Marion Smith run his business, Smith & Davis Builders. Whether skiing the slopes of the Wenatchee Valley or Sun Valley in Idaho, Lucille was in her element.

Lucille was preceded in death by her husband, Marion D. Smith of Independence, MO; her parents, Henry Loeb sack and Beatrice Love Loeb sack of Waterville; her brothers Lawrence and Leland Loeb sack of Waterville, WA. Lucille is survived by her three children: Stacy Webb and

Sharman Webb, both of Wenatchee; and Cynthia Howcroft of Bend, OR.
