Lucretia (Lou) Ann Titus, of Wenatchee, WA passed away peacefully in her sleep at home on January 8th, 2016. She was 74 years old.

Lou is survived by her daughters, Pamela Titus and her partner Gary Sherwood, Patty Lumsden and her husband Larry, and Tanya Adkisson and her husband Tom; her grandchildren, Jonathon, Jason, Melissa, Loren, and Alicia; her great grandchildren, Evan, David, Molly, and Honor Lucretia Ellestad; her ex-husband Gilbert Titus; her brother, Norman McIntyre and his wife Jackie; and many nieces and nephews.
