Marvin G. Ludeman, 79, passed away on Tuesday, July 31, 2012 in East Wenatchee, WA. He was born in Waterville on June 2, 1933 to Harry and Irene (Andrews) Ludeman. He graduated from Withrow High School in 1951. He attended Washington State University for 11/2 years.

On November 28, 1953, he married Clarice L. Mittelstaedt in Douglas, WA. He enlisted in the U.S. Air Force on January 26, 1953 stationed At Biloxi, Mississippi, Topeka, Kansas, where there daughter, Debbie was born; Korea, and Ephrata, WA. where Bob was born, and was honorable discharged on January 25, 1961. He returned to the family farm in 1959 and was a wheat farmer for many years. His son, Joe was born in Waterville. He was a member of the Wheat Growers Association for Douglas County and also was on the Waterville school board for 14 years. Marvin was a member of the United Lutheran Church in Waterville from 1959 to 1999 where he served on the church council and also taught Confirmation Classes for 2 years. He also was on the fire department board.

Marvin loved to play horseshoes winning many trophies and also taught how the game was to be played. He was a beautiful wood worker.

In 1999, they moved to East Wenatchee. He became a member of the Celebration Lutheran Church where he was very active in the church.

He was preceded in death by his parents, his sister, Helen, his daughter-in-law, Julie Ludeman, and 2 granddaughters, Mary Katherine and Lauren Ludeman.

He is survived by his wife, Clarice Ludeman of East Wenatchee; his children, Debbie (Kevin) Anderson of Las Vegas, Nevada, Bob (Sally) Ludeman of Mukilteo, WA and Joe Ludeman of Waterville; his 5 grandchildren; 2 great grandchildren; and numerous nieces and nephews.
