



## Mildred Bogart Scheibner

August 29, 1909 - January 7, 2015

Longtime Coulee City resident Mildred Bogart Scheibner passed away at her home on January 7, 2015. She was 105 years old. Mildred was born at her parents' home near St. Andrews on August 29, 1909.

Mildred graduated from Coulee City High School in 1927, then worked for the post office for a few years. In 1934 she married Maurice (Mac) Scheibner. They farmed the Bogart land near St. Andrews for 28 years where they raised their five daughters. Mildred moved into Coulee City in 1990 after her husband, Mac, passed away in 1988. She continued to live in her own home until her passing.

Mildred is survived by her daughters Nancy and her husband Don Smith of Modesto, California; June and her husband Ron West of Anacortes; Marilyn and her husband Larry of Coulee City; Carolyn and her husband Richard Welk of East Wenatchee; and Janet Evans of Coulee City. She also leaves behind her 14 grandchildren (seven boys and seven girls); 31 great grandchildren; four great, great grandchildren; her sisters, Doris Effman of Sacramento, California and Winifred Peterson of Renton, Washington. Preceding her in death were her parents Wendell and Ida Bogart; her husband Mac of 54 years, and her brother Maurice Bogart.

A celebration of life will be held at 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, January 17, at the

Coulee City Assembly of God Church. She will be interred at Highland Cemetery.
