



## Nancy F. Richardson

December 16, 1916 - October 23, 2015

Nancy F. Richardson passed away on October 23, 2015 at age 98. She was born December 16, 1916 to Peter and Leah Sele, in Enumclaw, WA. Nancy grew up in Tacoma, WA and graduated from Lincoln High School. Since 1998, she resided in Kirkland/Bothell, WA until her passing.

Nancy arrived in Wenatchee during WWII after traveling with a frozen food company through WA & OR. In Wenatchee, she attended business college and held a variety of office positions; her last position being at Valley Auto Co. On February 14, 1953, she married Howard E. Richardson and they built their home in Malaga, WA on 28 acres. Together the couple raised livestock and operated the Richardson Turkey Farm. In 1969, they started Shielded Rs Enterprises, which included a five-state vending machine business and rental properties in Malaga, WA.

Mrs. Richardson was a member of the Wenatchee First Assembly of God; and Disabled American Veterans Auxiliary No 17.

Nancy is preceded in death by her both her parents and husband. She is survived by a son, Peter H. Richardson and family who reside in Lake Forest, CA; a daughter Nella (Richardson) Cochran and family who reside in Snohomish, WA.
