Pearl E. Tisher, 92, of East Wenatchee WA, passed away on Saturday April 21, 2012 at her home with her family present. She was born September 10, 1919 in Bear Creek, WA to Gus and Katherine (Parks) Rambo.

Pearl lived in Bear Creek until 1940 when her family moved to Aberdeen, WA. She completed high school in Aberdeen and then in 1944 she married Howard R. Tisher in Silverdale, WA.
