She is also survived by four grand children, Brenda, Joseph, Sarah and Sydney who together have six great-grand children including most recently a daughter Brooke Baker, born to Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Baker who she recently saw on or about her eighty-ninth birthday.

She had a long and active life of eighty-nine years and enjoyed a wide variety of interests and hobbies. She began working very young in life to help support her mother and her eight brothers and sisters after the untimely death of their father. As an adult, she moved out west to California where she became a lead instructor in ballroom dancing which she continued to enjoy for many years.

She had a life-long love for her mother, her brothers and sisters, her own family and working with many children in the Orthodontics career which she enjoyed for over two decades. She liked making good food including baked curry chicken casseroles with glazed carrots, carrot cakes and corn bread from scratch.

She enjoyed Camellias in her garden and grew some of her own

vegetables and enjoyed many outdoor activities. She was very fond of visiting her brother Deal (now deceased) in San Diego, California during the summer months with her two sons. They all enjoyed fresh ocean air at the beach, sunshine and the boys enjoyed swimming in the ocean very much.

She was also proficient at making and wearing her own clothing and also made clothing for her two young children. Mother will be greatly missed and fondly remembered for her sweet personality, her personal patience and unique kindness. She had a long working career as she continued working until the age of seventy-eight after which she traveled north from California to Washington State to be close to her children, grand-children and great-grand children who live in the Northwest.

Mother passed away from us on February 19, 2014 in E. Wenatchee, Washington. She died peacefully of end-stage Parkinson's disease in her bed at Highline Care Center where she was lovingly cared for these last years of her life by a very kind and compassionate nursing staff. She was also comforted by a Washington State Hospice Team and tenderly cared for by her loving grand-daughter Mrs. Sarah Lloyd.

During a personal conversation with my mother in early February 2014 she called upon the Lord Jesus Christ to save her at the age of eighty-nine.

Funeral services will be private and her earthy body will be buried next to her deceased son Michael at Stemilt Cemetery, Washington State as she had long wished to remain close to him and his family.
