The last 5 years of his life, I got the honored privilege of hearing those prayers, as he didn't know I was standing nearby. He prayed for all his relationships and all of his friends. He had such a good and loving heart, every night he would tell me, "Son, be sure you tell everyone I love them". I think he loved the world and the life it had given him.

He would tell us as kids, "Don't kill no dead snakes" or "Don't drink out of no dry mud puddles"... Ray is now with his friend Jesus and we'll never have to worry about him doing either. The world will dearly miss him.
