



Richard "Dick" Clark Johnson

December 12, 1918 - July 1, 2010

Richard "Dick" Johnson, 91, passed away on July 1, 2010. He was born December 12, 1918, in Seattle, WA to Clark and Mary Johnson. The Johnson family moved to Wenatchee when he was very young. After completing his education in Wenatchee, Dick served in the U.S. Army during WWII. Dick married Louise Daniels on May 26, 1948, at the First Methodist Church in Edmonds, WA. After living a short time in Wenatchee, the couple moved to Burbank, CA. He drove for Greyhound for 32 years, over one million miles with no accidents, for which he received an award. During those years, Dick was a motorcycle enthusiast and participated in group rides throughout the deserts. He also enjoyed traveling in Mexico; so much so, that he began to study the Spanish language. Dick and Louise returned to Wenatchee in 1983, after retirement. He continued his studies at Wenatchee Valley College, and began to serve as a volunteer tutor for the ESL program. He continued tutoring many years, and helped countless Hispanic members of the community to learn English. A man of many interests, Dick also loved motorhoming and spending time sitting by a campfire in Washington State Parks.

He is survived by his wife, Louise; and daughter, Eve. He is also survived by grandchildren, Frank, Teddi and Sky; as well as great-grandchildren, Vanesa, Harmony, Taylor and Salena. He was preceded in death by his parents; and brother, Bob.
