She attended school in Lone, Cusack and Spokane Washington. In the summer of 1953 she met Tom Sherwood, and they were married on November 24 of that same year, in Coeur d'Alene, Idaho. From this marriage they had four children, John, Tim, Yvonne, and Pam. They made their home in Cashmere until they moved to Wenatchee in 1967. Ruby was a waitress in Cashmere and Wenatchee. For many years she was a cook at the Eye and Ear clinic cafeteria, and later at the Franklin House. She worked at Chief Wenatchee sorting fruit, and delivered flowers for Kunz Flower shop before retiring in 1998.

Her C.B. radio handle was Honeybee. She and her husband (Hillbilly) directed out of town trucks to the different fruit warehouses and other businesses in the area for many years. They also toured the U.S. and parts of Canada on their motorcycle and enjoyed going camping in their fifth wheel trailer with their children and other family members. 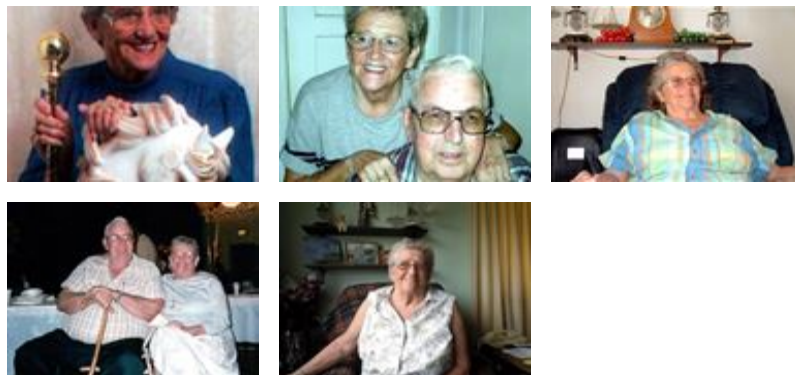
