January 16, 1921 - January 29, 2010

Velma E. Stout, 89, of Wenatchee, Washington, died in her home with family present on Friday, 29th of January, 2010 of Alzheimer's disease.

She was born January 16, 1921, at Edgemont, South Dakota, the daughter of Glenford and Bertha Swigert . The family moved to Fort Sumner, New Mexico where she met her future husband Jesse Clinton, (J.C.) Stout. They were married September 24, 1937. Their first daughter , Beverly Kay was born at Fort Sumner in 1939. They moved to Albuquerque, New Mexico where James Lynn was born in 1942, and also their daughter Carol Ann was born in 1946. It was in Albuquerque in 1943 that the sweet influence of the Gospel came into their lives uniting them with a worldwide fellowship of Christians. Stephen Shorten and James Walden were the two ministers who introduced them to that Gospel, which brought peace and eternal hope.

In 1945, they moved to Modesto, California where they raised their children. At retirement in 1983 they moved to Wenatchee.

Survivors include her sister, Marjorie Bearden of Plainview, Texas; children, Kay Stout of Wenatchee, WA., Jim and Susan Stout of Gencsapati, Hungary, Carol and Lou Edwards of Spokane WA.; grandchildren Lori and John Naylor of Spokane, Jeffrey and Monica Stout of Haines, Alaska, and Jamie and Grace Stout of Anchorage, Alaska; great grand children, MacKenzie, Henry, and Patrick Naylor, and Haley and Anna Stout. She was preceded in death by her husband, J.C., and her brother Ralph Duane Swigert, as well as her parents Glenford and Bertha Swigert.
