



William L. "Bill" Dalton

January 21, 1927 - February 15, 2015

William L. (Bill) Dalton lived by these words until his passing on February 15, 2015.

Bill was born in Wilmington DE on January 21, 1927 to Harry L. Dalton and Estelle E. (Wise) Dalton. He joined his brother, Harry R. in this military family. Bill's father was a bandleader for the U.S. Army and they traveled extensively during Bill's youth. The family was stationed at Fort DuPont, Fort Clayton, Fort Logan, Fort Bliss and Fort Brown. His most memorable assignment was in Corozal, Panama where Bill first joined the Boy Scouts.

After graduation from high school in 1945, Bill enlisted in the Army. He was stationed in Zama, Japan with the Army of Occupation.

Returning home, he attended Chaffey Community College where he met the beautiful Anna Ruth Miller. They were married in 1951. From this union there were three daughters, Denise A. (John) Shutler, Mary Beth (Bob) Sherwood and Kristen L. (Jon) Peirce.

Bill's career with the Boy Scouts started in 1959. He was assigned to several Scouting Councils including Santa Barbara, Los Angeles, Fresno, Santa Maria, Salt Lake City and his final career move to Wenatchee in 1977. Bill

retired from the BSA in 1992.

During the family's time in Wenatchee, Ann was diagnosed with a brain tumor in 1985 and ovarian cancer in 1993. Ann died December 1993.

Bill met and married Judy Meinzer in 1995. With this marriage he added two more daughters to his family, Casey E. (Ben) Carrow and Allison M. Meinzer.

Bill was loved and respected by many and will be missed by his family and friends.

He is survived by his wife, Judy, three daughters, two step-daughters, 7 grandchildren, 7 step-grandchildren, 3 great-grandchildren and a community full of very dear friends.

“ I always remember Bill being there for Rotary projects to lend a hand in so many ways. He encouraged us all and had a kind word for people. What a member he was for me as a new member.

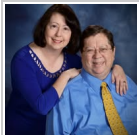
